Irrigation Safety

- Wear appropriate PPE.
 - Sturdy, waterproof footwear, gloves, ear plugs/muffs when necessary, and safety glasses. Hardhats may be necessary for completing many of the tasks associated with irrigation.
 - Remove jewelry; secure loose clothing and long hair.
 - Be alert for changing weather conditions!
 - Know the location of all ditches, risers, and pivot tracks.
 - Assume all lines are pressurized; keep your face away from all valves when adjusting.
 - Regularly inspect and maintain all system components.
 - Repeatedly tripped circuit breakers or blown fuses could indicate a serious issue.
 - Know the location of all overhead powerline and telephone lines! Watch for any other overhead obstructions.
 - Keep objects as low as possible during transport.
 - Avoid lifting pipes vertically. Move pipes in the horizontal position whenever possible.
 - Use proper lifting technique. Keep your elbows close to your sides for better leverage.
 - Remove excess water or overgrown vegetation to help reduce weight.
 - Deenergize all power sources completely before servicing or repairing.
 - Use appropriate lockout procedures.
 - Ensure lockout procedures are sufficient to protect against accidental starting on newer “phone controlled” units.
 - Use a voltmeter to confirm power has been deenergized.
 - Use a ‘backhand’ technique for making initial contact with any electrical components.
- Remember, water increases your susceptibility to electric shock!**
- Ensure adequate working space is maintained around all electrical components. You should never have to bend over, kneel, or lay on your back, side, or stomach to operate a switch or other control device.
 - Make sure all electrical devices are properly grounded.
 - Use proper fall protection, when necessary.
 - Stake or block wheel lines to prevent runaway sections when not in use.
 - Utilize all screens and guards. Use extreme caution around unguarded pullies, belts, or drive shafts.
 - Maintain adequate ventilation in pump houses.
 - Never allow irrigation water to come in contact with electrical lines. If contact occurs, do not attempt to move the system. Contact your electrical utility provider for assistance.
 - Notify others of fields being chemigated/fertigated to avoid accidental exposure.
 - Avoid making contact with high pressure water streams (like those from an end gun) with any part of your body.
 - Use extreme caution around bodies of open water (ponds, ditches, canals, etc.). Know proper emergency response techniques if waders are to be worn.
